# 24 inches above the seasonal high water table?

This will have to be determined by a permitted designer or homeowner reading a test pit dug next to the existing septic system. Again if the answer is yes, a NH construction approval is needed.

REMEMBER: If you've answered yes to any of the above questions, your septic system does not qualify for Repair and Replacement of Existing Systems under Env-Wq 1003.10.

### **Notes:**

It is the responsibility of all contractors to obtain the necessary permits from the Code Enforcement office at City Hall before any work has begun.

It is the responsibility of the contractor to obtain all inspections required. **A bed bottom inspection is required by the City. A twenty-four (24) hour notice is required for any inspection. ** This signed application constitutes consent on the applicant's part to allow for all inspections at the property location listed.

**STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE:** I hereby apply for permission to make certain improvements as described above (plans to be submitted, if required by the building inspector). I have read and understand the statement and hereby agree to all of the terms stated therein. I agree to abide by any and all codes relating to the work, including all national, state and local codes.
