- A. Resolution No. 29-22: To Amend Council Rules and Regulations Section 7, Order of Business. Mayor Hilliard has referred this Resolution to the Government Operations Committee. The Committee has scheduled a meeting for this coming Wednesday, April 6th.

A. Resolution No. 31-22: To Authorize the City Manager to Execute a Contract Amendment Requested by Waste Management Of New Hampshire, Inc. for Collection and Disposal of Municipal Solid Waste, Municipal Recycling, and Wastewater Treatment Sludge. The Finance Committee met on March 21st and voted to recommend this action. Attached is a Memorandum from Finance Director Scott Smith with the cost breakdown of this Contract Amendment, and a copy of the proposed Amendments.

- B. Resolution No. 32-22: To Authorize the City Manager to Accept and Execute a Modified Grant Agreement Increasing Grant Funds with the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services for the Cleanup Grant Award for the Former Somersworth Police Station Located at 5 Main Street. Attached is a letter from NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES), Michael McCluskey, stating that the NHDES intends to amend the Grant by increasing the amount from \$97,450 to \$149,895. The Grant funding covers both the consultant's contract (Credere Associates) and the contracted work to complete the clean-up work.
- C. Resolution No. 33-22: To Authorize the City Manager to Contract with Wickson Construction NH, LLC of Rye, NH for the Replacement of a Culvert on Rocky Hill Road. The City received two (2) bids for this Culvert Replacement. The Finance Committee met on March 21st and voted to support Staff's recommendation to move forward with Wickson Construction, the lowest bid received. Attached is a Memorandum from Public Works Director Mike Bobinsky explaining Staff's recommendation.
- D. Resolution No. 34-22: To Authorize the City Manager to Contract with EnviroVantage of Epping, NH for the Abatement and Removal of Asbestos, PCBS, and a Fuel Oil Tank at the Former Somersworth Police Station Located at 5 Main Street. Attached is a copy of their bid. The Grant funds will allow us to complete the base bids and all the optional bids. Eleven (11) companies were invited to bid. The City received two (2) bids, EnviroVantage being the low bid.

Re: Waste Management Proposed Contract Amendment

City Counter Offer – 3.5% 7/1/22 and 3.5% 7/1/23

Staff has evaluated the impact of Waste Management's (WM) request to increase collection and disposal costs an additional 7% over current amounts currently under contract. The following is the impact should the City be agreeable to WM request, but offers to phase it in over two years.

Solid Waste Collection (Pay-Per-Bag program)

- The current estimated disposal cost for municipal solid waste in FY23 is \$496,237. The City would need to increase that estimate to \$510,246, an increase of \$14,009.
- As of July 1, 2023, the second phase of 3.5% increase, the rates would be very close to the same as the would be under WM request for a 7% increase effective 7/1/22.
- Phasing in the increase over two years will save the City approximately \$7,000 over the life of the contract.

Recycling collection

- The increase in collection costs for recycling in year 1 if the City phases in the increase is \$5,295.
- Phasing in the increase over two years will save the City approximately \$4,900 over the life of the contract

Wastewater Sludge Collection and Disposal

- WM request under the sludge agreement is to increase that rate an additional 5% over the scheduled 5% increase.
- If the City were to consider a one-time additional increase of 3.5%, the estimated cost for sludge disposal would be \$274,329. This is approximately \$4,000 less of an increase than if the City accepted an increase of 5%.

Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund - Cleanup Grant

Dear Robert Belmore:

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) is pleased to inform the City of Somersworth of our intent to amend the previously awarded cleanup grant from New Hampshire's Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) pursuant to a request from the City for additional funding. NHDES had previously awarded a \$97,450 cleanup grant to address hazardous building materials within the former Police Station located at 5 Main Street in Somersworth, New Hampshire. NHDES intends to amend the grant by increasing the grant amount from \$97,450 to \$149,895 in order to cover a funding gap resulting from contractor bids coming in well over the original project budget.

In order to award the additional subgrant funds we must enter into a Grant Agreement Amendment approved by the Governor and Executive Council (G&C). Enclosed is the proposed Grant Agreement Amendment. Please review this document carefully. If everything is satisfactory based on your review, please submit the following:

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement (hereinafter called the Agreement) approved by the Governor and Executive Council on May 19, 2021, the Grantee agreed to perform certain services upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of payment by the State of certain sums as specified therein; and

WHEREAS, The Grantee and the State have agreed to amend the Agreement in certain respects,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions contained in the Agreement and set forth herein, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **Amendment and Modification of Agreement**: The Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
 - (A) The Grant Limitation as set forth in sub-paragraph 1.8 of the Agreement shall be changed from \$97,450 to \$149,895.
 - (B) The Grant Amount as set forth in the first paragraph of Exhibit B shall be changed from \$97,450 to \$149,895.
- 2. **Effective Date of Amendment**: This Amendment shall take effect upon the date of approval of this Amendment by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire.
- 3. **Continuance of Agreement**: Except as specifically amended and modified by the terms and conditions of this Amendment, the Agreement, and the obligations of the parties thereunder, shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth therein.

EXHIBIT A SCOPE OF SERVICES

The City of Somersworth intends to use the grant funds for the remediation of environmental contamination at the Former Police Station located at 5 Main Street in Somersworth, New Hampshire.

Grant funds will be used for the mitigation of hazardous building materials.

EXHIBIT B BUDGET AND PAYMENT METHOD

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (the "State") agrees to grant to the City of Somersworth (the "Grantee") the sum of \$149,895 ("Grant Amount") to be used by Grantee only for cleanup-related activities.

The Grant Amount shall be payable to Grantee as reimbursement for eligible and allowable expenses incurred by Grantee based upon actual costs incurred for Project work. No reimbursement shall be made to Grantee without written approval of the Department of Environmental Services.

The Grantee may request a maximum of one reimbursement payment per month on forms provided by the State and shall include documentation of Project work completed and the eligible costs incurred by the Grantee.

EXHIBIT C SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. Area Covered:

- 1.1 The Grantee shall perform the Project on certain real property commonly referred to as the Former Police Station property located at 5 Main Street in Somersworth, New Hampshire (the "Property"), which property is more particularly described in the Quitclaim Deed recorded at the Strafford County Registry of Deeds on September 10, 2013 at book 4163, page 0691.
- 1.2 The Grantee shall retain ownership of the Property between the Effective Date and the Completion Date. For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "owns" means fee simple title.

- 2. Completion of Project: The Grantee shall commence work on the Project within 180 days of the Effective Date and shall complete and perform all of the work by December 31, 2022 (the "Completion Date").
- 3. Environmental Report(s): The Grantee shall provide the State with a copy of an American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) E1527-05 or equivalent Phase I Environmental Site Assessment report for the Property and an ASTM E1903-97 or equivalent Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (i.e., a site investigation that meets the requirements of New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Env-Or 600 Contaminated Site Management) (collectively, the "Assessment"). The Grantee agrees that the grant funds shall not be used for the payment of any cost or expense related to the Assessment.
- 4. **Project Manager:** The State shall designate an environmental project manager who shall review and approve of the proposed cleanup and coordinate the work to be performed using grant funds. The State's environmental project manager will review the Grantee's remedial planning, design, and engineering documents and review the cleanup activities as they are on-going to ensure that the cleanup is being completed in accordance with all local, State, and Federal requirements and is protective of human health and the environment.
- **5. Remedial Action Plan:** The Grantee shall prepare a Remedial Action Plan (RAP) that meets the requirements of the New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Env-Or 600 *Contaminated Site Management*. The Grantee shall submit copies of the RAP to the State for review and approval.
- 6. Remedial Action Implementation Report: The Grantee shall prepare a Remedial Action Implementation Report that meets the requirements of New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules Env-Or 600 Contaminated Site Management. The report shall be submitted to the State for review and approval within ninety (90) days following completion of the Project.
- **7. Event of Default:** In addition to the Events of Default specified in Subparagraph 11.1 of the General Provisions, any one or more of the following acts or omissions of the Grantee shall constitute an Event of Default:
 - a. The Grantee sells or transfers the Property prior to the Completion Date.
 - b. Any representation or warranty made herein or in any report, certificate, financial statement or other instrument furnished in connection with this Agreement shall prove to be false in any material respect.

Re: Rocky Hill Road Culvert Replacement- Wickson Construction

Background:

Bids were received for the Rocky Hill Road Culvert replacement on March 17, 2022. Two bids were received including Wickson Construction and JP Cardillos & Sons. Following review staff recommends selecting Wickson Construction. Their bid was responsive to the City specifications and was lowest bid.

Staff has completed a background investigation using references provided by Wickson Construction. Work history indicates that Wickson has served as a subcontractor to general contractors mostly working on military bases within the area and want to serve as general contractors on municipal projects. City Engineer Amber Hall spoke with three (3) references provided by the contractor and is summarized as follows:

- 1. KDE Building, Dave Heavener, Project Manager Worked on a few projects together. Their experience was good, and noted they needed support with some administrative aspects of the military contracts. Wickson work included grading, drainage, water, sewer, gas, and electrical. The work was done well.
- 2. New Dominion, Brian Richards, Project Manager Recommend 100%, estimates and schedules were on budget and on time. They have had recurring contracts for a few years. Work included steam and condensate lines, water, sewer, drainage, at Shipyard projects.
- 3. Kinsmen Corp, Gene Connor, President "worked on many successful projects together and have enjoyed a good working relationship with Rick and his team. They are a well-qualified and skilled group and the City should have no reservations about working with them."


Based on the background investigation, the fact that the contractor is responsive on the specification and is lowest bidder, I recommend we move forward with Wickson Construction. In addition, after review, I recommend including bid alternate #1, (sewer main replacement) and bid alternate #2. (concrete arch pipe) as part of the contract award.


