A. Ordinance No. 7-21: To Amend Chapter 6 – City Officials, Section 6.6.2.4, Public Safety Committee.

### **Ordinances**

A. Ordinance No. 5-21: To Amend Chapter 19 – Zoning, Definitions, Section 25.B, Agricultural Use. This Ordinance was referred back to the Public Works & Environment Committee.

#### **Resolutions**

A. Resolution No. 13-21: To Authorize the City to use Funding from the Furber Memorial Chapel Expendable Trust Fund as a Portion of the City's Match to a Land and Community Heritage Investment Program Grant for the Roof Restoration Project on the Furber Memorial Chapel. Again, the Finance Committee met on October 7th and voted to recommend the entire balance of the Furber Chapel Memorial Trust Fund, which is approximately \$10,000, be used for this project to help provide the required City funding match of this Grant. If approved, this action will close this Fund. Note: This was scheduled for a November second reading, however due to clerical error it was not placed on the Agenda.

### New Business (under Section 15 of Agenda)

### Resolutions

- A. Resolution No. 21-21: To Notify the City Tax Collector that the City Council Shall Not Accept a Tax Deed on Certain Properties Subject to an Unredeemed Tax Lien. The Finance Committee took up this matter at their December 9th meeting and voted to support Resolution No. 21-21 & Resolution No. 22-21 to the full Council. This recommendation is based on the past practice to deed the most delinquent properties and allow more time for others to come into tax payment compliance. Attached is information provided to the Finance Committee on December 9th.
- B. Resolution No. 22-21: To Notify the Tax Collector that the City Council Shall Not Accept a Tax Deed on Properties Located on Wexford Lane and Blackwater Road Subject to an Unredeemed Tax Lien. The recommendation of 'not to accept' is based on the land containing buried debris; i.e., potential contamination clean-up costs.
- C. Resolution No. 23-21: City Council Vote to Conditionally Lay Out Nadeau Street as a Class V Roadway Subject to the Condition that this Vote is not Final Until the City Council Receives Certification from the City Engineer that all Improvements Have Been Made to City Standards.


### City Manager's Items (under section 11 of Agenda)

Section 6.6.2.4 Public Safety Committee

The purpose of the Committee is to consider matters relating to Police and Fire services and other emergency response needs of the City, as well as other matters referred to it. In order to be proactive and to continuously improve our quality of life, the Committee may also provide recommendations and guidance for Police, Fire, and other emergency operations in delivering services ethically and effectively to ensure the safety and security of the Public; and Public Trust is not compromised.

This Ordinance will take effect upon passage.

TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY TO USE FUNDING FROM THE FURBER MEMORIAL CHAPEL EXPENDABLE TRUST FUND AS A PORTION OF THE CITY'S MATCH TO A LAND AND COMMUNITY HERITAGE INVESTMENT PROGRAM GRANT FOR THE ROOF RESTORATION PROJECT ON THE FURBER MEMORIAL CHAPEL

### October 19, 2020

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 25-20 to authorize the City Manager to enter into a grant agreement with the State of New Hampshire for a Land and Community Heritage Investment Program Grant to replace and restore the roof on the Furber Memorial Chapel, and

WHEREAS, city staff received bids for this project from qualified contractors and recommended awarding the project to Alden Bailey Restoration Corp. of Ridgefield, Connecticut, and

WHERAS, the Finance Committee reviewed this recommendation from staff and authorized awarding the contract for this project to Alden Bailey Restoration Corp. for an amount not to exceed \$55,000 (Fifty-Five Thousand dollars) including contingency, and

WHEREAS, to complete this project the City is required to provide a 50% match in the amount of \$27,500 (Twenty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred dollars), and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the City utilize the full balance available in the Furber Memorial Chapel Expendable Trust Fund to provide a portion of the City's match in the amount of approximately \$10,000 (Ten Thousand dollars) and close the fund,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the City may utilize the full balance available in the Furber Memorial Chapel Expendable Trust Fund to provide a portion of the City's match for the roof restoration project on the Furber Memorial Chapel.




