Unfinished Business (under Section 15 of Agenda)

Ordinances

A. Ordinance No. 7-24: Amend Chapter 13 Police Offenses, Section 3 Traffic Control. Again, the Traffic and Safety Committee recommends this Ordinance change. This 2-hour parking was put into place when General Electric was active. Therefore, the 2-hour limit is no longer needed in this area. If approved, the Lord's Court change will allow residents along the Road to park there during months when snow plowing does not occur. Presently, there is no parking allowed for the entire 12 months each year on Lord's Court.

New Business (under Section 16 of Agenda)

Resolutions

- A. Resolution 28-24: Proclamation Declaring January Diversity Month in the City of Somersworth. City Council should consider waiving Council Rules to act on this Resolution this evening.
- B. Resolution 29-24: To Authorize the City Manager to Enter into a Grant Agreement with the New Hampshire State Library and to Accept a Moose Plate Grant Award for Vital Record Preservation. Attached is a copy of the Grant Agreement for this Vital Record Project. The City will conduct preservation treatment, microfilm, and digitally scan 3 volumes of Marriage, Birth, and Death records for the years 1938-1940. My appreciation is extended to the City Clerk's office for successfully seeking out this Grant Fund opportunity.

A. Constitutional Complete Streets Project. Wright-Pierce Engineers has informed us that we will have the final bid documents to us by January 5th. Staff is finalizing a bid release date this week, with bids due back in early February.

- **B. Sports Hub Dome.** Staff completed a pre-construction meeting this past Thursday. As you may have seen, the site prep work has started. The developer's timeline for opening the facility is November 1st of this year.

In accordance with the City Charter the vacancy will be posted within City Hall for fourteen (14) days and advertised in a local newspaper three (3) times.

WHEREAS, the City of Somersworth values its history and understands the importance of preserving and maintaining the City's records; and

Specifically: The City of Somersworth will conduct preservation treatment, microfilm, and digitally scan 3 volumes of Marriage, Birth, and Death records for the years 1938-1940.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: Funding credit must appear in all programs, publicity, and promotional materials. The following wording is suggested.

"This preservation project has been made possible through funds received from the sale of the New Hampshire Moose Conservation License Plate and administered by the New Hampshire State Library, a division of the New Hampshire Department of Cultural Resources."

FINAL GRANT REPORTS: The Grantee agrees to submit final narrative and financial reports on a form provided by the State Library by December 31, 2024. Failure to submit final reports will render the Grantee ineligible for future Conservation License Plate Grant funding within the NH Department of Natural and Cultural Resources.

Exhibit C Payment Terms

GRANT AMOUNT: Total granted amount shall not exceed \$9,249.

PAYMENT METHOD and TERM: Payment will be made upon the acceptance of this grant agreement in the amount of ninety percent (90%) and in the amount of ten percent (10%) upon the acceptance of final grant reports and approval upon approval by the Governor and Executive Council through December 31, 2024.
