

The Mayor's Corner


We are still accepting submissions for the Mayor's Quarterly Art Show.

What Happening in Development Services

ERZ Tax Credit Program Deadline: February 10, 2024

ERZ stands for Economic Revitalization Zone. The ERZ tax credit program, which is detailed in RSA 162-N, offers a short-term business tax credit for projects that improve infrastructure and create jobs in designated areas of a municipality.



Somersworth Designated ERZ Area

- 1) Business and Historical Mill District
- 2) Route 108 Transportation Corridor

What does this mean for Somersworth Businesses?

Businesses located within Somersworth designated ERZ can apply for tax credit. Somersworth benefits from ERZs by the job growth of its businesses located in the community, and by potential growth of the local tax base due to expansion of the business's plant and equipment assets. For a business to qualify for an ERZ tax credit it must invest in plant or equipment and create a least one (1) new full-time job in the state, and meet the following criteria:

The business must be physically located in an approved ERZ.

- · Investment in plant or equipment must be made directly by the business applying for the ERZ tax credit.
- · Jobs must be full time, direct employees, and not be contracted or "temp" jobs.
- The investment and the job creation must take place within one calendar year.

If you have any questions on whether something is considered capital investment, you can check with your accountant or the Tax Incentive Program Manager.

How is the Credit Calculated? The credit is based on a percent of the salary for each new full-time job created and the lesser of: either a percent of the actual cost incurred for the project or a maximum credit for each new job created in the fiscal year


What is considered a full-time job? A full-time job is at least 35 hours per week and is a permanent, year-round position.

How can a Business in the Community Claim the Credit?

The deadline to apply must be post marked by **February 10** each year. To apply for the tax credits, an applicant must complete form **ERZ-2** available from the Department of Business and Economic Affair's website.

Community Survey – Open until Feb. 9th

A graduate student at UMass Amherst is conducting a research study of Somersworth, Great Barrington, MA and Hartford, VT titled "Bright Spots in Small Town New England: A Study of Racial and Ethnic Diversity, Equity, and Belonging." In her initial research, Emily Hodos identified Somersworth as a community with an increasing population of color and with recent economic measures showing that people of color are living at relatively similar levels to the total population. To gain a deeper understanding of the community's demographics, strengths, and challenges, Hodos has launched a community survey designed for anyone 18+ who lives, works, and/or

Natural Resources & Land Use Chapter

Master Plan Update

In the new year, Planning staff and partners from the Strafford Regional Planning Commission began kicking off updates to the City's Land Use and Natural Resource Master Plan chapters, through a project funded by a grant from the <u>Piscataqua Region Estuaries Partnership</u>. Through March, the project team will work with the Planning Board and Conservation Commission to gain insight on implementation progress toward existing actions in the plan, generate new goals, and craft a vision for the future. The current Master Plan hasn't seen an update since 2010, and the last update to the city's Natural Resource <u>Inventory</u> occurred in 2016. This project seeks to generate an engaged planning process to identify and characterize critical natural resources, build consensus among community members around management approaches, and create an ambitious but achievable and measurable implementation plan that balances community interests, integrates local and regional goals, and is based on the most up to date and best available science. 
Quality Time is a new initiative offered by local seasoned teacher, Diana Metreaud. This program offers a unique approach to exploring social-


The Library offers its patrons many services that you may not be aware of. Some of these include:




Interlibrary Loan Program

2024 Alarm Permit Renewal Notices will be be mailed soon. If you own a fire alarm or security system alarm, ordinances require you to obtain a permit. To renew your permit the fee is \$10.00 if paid before the end of January, 2024 or \$20.00 after. If the alarm is for a residence and you are 65 or older, your



permit is free. If you have questions, please call Karen at the Somersworth PD at 603-841-2917 or email: <u>Kcantrell@Somersworthnh.gov</u>.

If you own an alarm system (including those self installed) and have never obtained a permit, you can simply go to:

https://www.somersworthnh.gov/police/pages/forms-applications The fee is \$25.00 for your first alarm permit. Alarm permits for residence alarms that are 65 or older are free until February 1.



Snow Emergencies/Winter Parking Ban

Snow Emergencies can be called at any time, day or night. During Snow Emergencies, a Parking Ban is in effect. Always be aware of overnight weather forecasts and have alternative parking plans when snow is predicted. Your vehicle can be towed during a Snow Emergency and you will have to pay the tow charge to get it back. The

purpose of the parking ban is to enable Public Works to safely maintain the roads. This means sometimes there will be a Snow Emergency declared even when it is no longer snowing. Snow emergencies are announced on the following stations: WTSN, WOKQ, WERZ, WSHK, WHEB, WMUR Channel 9 and Local Cable Station Channel 22. You may also call the Winter Ban Hot Line at 692-9131. To receive news of parking bans via email, go to www.Somersworthnh.gov and click "Subscribe-City Email:.

Somersworth Police Department also uses our Facebook page to give important community information and we send out Nixle alerts for parking bans and other important information to cell phones and emails. You can sign up for Nixle at www.Nixle.com.

Avoid the parking ticket and the tow (at your expense) by paying attention to snow emergency information.

SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING PERMITS

Permits for Noble Street and River Street parking during snow emergency parking bans are available.

Somersworth allows permit parking during snow emergency parking bans on Noble Street adjacent to the Noble Pines Park, and on River Street adjacent to Jules Bisson Park.

Permits to park there during parking bans resulting from a snow emergency are available from November 1 thru March 31 at a rate of \$20.00 per month, and are available at the Police Department.

There are 17 spaces available on Noble Street and 5 spaces available on River Street. Permits will be issued on a first come, first served basis. The permits are only valid during the dates listed when there is a snow emergency parking ban in effect.

Vehicles parked in this area with a valid permit must be moved by 8 am on the day following the completion of the parking ban to allow for snow removal from the designated area.

Vehicles not moved will be subject to being towed at the owner's expense.

Solid Waste & Recycling

Solid Waste and Recycling News Holiday Update: There will be No Change to the regular schedule for residential trash and recycling collection for President's Day, Monday, February 19, 2024.

Also be mindful of setting out trash and recycling containers the night before a snow storm event as they may get plowed in. Consider set out day of

trash collection by 7am.

Reminder the next Metal/Electronics curbside collection by Public Works crews will occur on Tuesday, February 13. Residents should call by Monday, February 12 to be placed on the pick-up list. Bulky waste stickers are required and can be purchased at City Hall, City Clerk office (cash, check or credit card) or at the DPW building at 18 Lilac Lane by **check only**. The number to call at Public Works is 692-4266.

High Street Traffic Signal Upgrade Project

The City has recently completed an improvements to the High Street corridor traffic signals. The following traffic signals were upgraded and improved recently using a federal CMAQ (Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality) Grant:

- Blackwater Road at High Street
- Stackpole Road at High Street
- Waltons Way at High Street
- Andrews Road at High Street
- Tri City Plaza at High Street
- Kelwyn Drive

The traffic signal upgrade includes new electronic traffic controller cabinets, GridSmart cameras to allow traffic to have reduce idle times, pedestrian countdown signals and push buttons, crosswalk safety signage, ADA compliant tip downs and remote access for adjusting traffic cycle times.

Private Snow in Public Ways? NOT ALLOWED!

Residents and commercial property owners are reminded that the City Ordinance prohibits anyone from depositing ice or snow from private property onto the City streets or sidewalks. Residents and commercial property owners are asked to remind their private snow plow operators that the snow from their driveways or parking lots may not be pushed into the City streets or sidewalks. This activity inhibits pedestrians from safely accessing those City sidewalks, forcing them to walk in the streets, which is an unsafe situation.


Park Updates:



The Somersworth Music Program Gets Energized

Devin DiBernardo came to Somersworth School District to lead its music program at about the same time COVID-19 was loosening its grip on schools nationwide. Like so many districts, Somersworth's band suffered a

drop in enrollment. Limited practice sessions and a shift toward core academics

left enrichment programs wanting.

Originally a saxophone player who moved to French horn, Devin studied music education at UNH. He came to Somersworth after teaching at Merrimack Valley High School, up for the challenge of working with kids from a nearby community similar to his upbringing in neighboring Rochester, NH. With his move to Somersworth Schools, DiBernardo came with a growing list of priorities focused on breathing new life into the music program.

To rebuild low music program enrollment across Somersworth, DiBernardo was seeking to create a more cohesive music program from grades K through 12. He focused on exposing kids to music at an early age. Working with music teachers Mark DeTurk and Brenda LaForce and Marshwood High School band director David Graichen, he brought middle and high school musicians to Idlehurst and Maple Wood elementary schools to play and demonstrate musical instruments. He remembered how much these visits meant to him as a child. "There's nothing cooler than having the *big kids* stop by to show you their instruments. This is when you start thinking about which instruments you'd like to play someday." **Read More...**


