Special Municipal Election Tuesday, September 11

The City of Somersworth will be holding a Special Municipal Election on Tuesday, September 11, 2018, to fill the **Ward 5 City Council** seat for the remainder of the term to expire in January 2020.

FILING PERIOD

In Accordance with RSA 669:16, the filing period for Declaration of Candidacy for the Ward 5 City Council Seat will open on July 25, 2018 and close on August 3, 2018.

Persons wishing to be a candidate in the September 11th Special Municipal Election must file a Declaration of Candidacy in the Office of the City Clerk during the filing period. A \$5.00 filing fee is due at the time of filing. In lieu of paying the fee, a candidate may elect to file 25 notarized petitions.

Candidates must be qualified voters residing in Ward 5 in the City of Somersworth. Names of all candidates will be placed on the ballot in order pursuant to RSA 656:5-a.

Safety Tips from your Local Fire Department 692-3457

Open Burning continues in September. Remember that the state requires a Permit be obtained from the Fire Department before burning occurs. Generally, unless it is raining, no burning can occur until after 5pm and there are restrictions on what can be burned: distances from combustible construction or vegetation: and the size of materials to be burned.

A word of caution to all drivers: School is back in session and children will be walking back and forth to and from school. Exercise care when driving as sometimes children are distracted when walking and may venture out into traffic without warning.

Fire Department Open House.

The annual Fire Department Open House will be held on Saturday October 13 from 10am to 2pm. There will be displays from the Fire Department utilizing the "Fire Safety House" and live fire extinguisher training. Other agencies there will be the Somersworth Police: American Ambulance: Wentworth Douglass Hospital: the NH Division of Forest and Lands: and Smokey the Bear. Refreshments will be provided as well.



Road Improvement Updates:

Somersworth City Council has recently voted to award a contract to Brox Industries for road repairs. This letter shows an overall view of the repairs to be conducted throughout the City. Repairs will include all of Constitutional Way, Garden Street, Horne Street, Otis Road, Salmon Falls Road, Tates Brook Road, Washington Street, and portions of High Street (from Blackwater Road to South Street) and West High Street (from

Route 108 to Cemetery Road), and Main Street (John Parsons Drive to Indigo Hill Road). Weather-permitting, the current projected schedule is to begin work on West High Street and Salmon Falls Road or Otis Road in September, with the rest of the work occurring from September through November and possibly in the spring of 2019.

As a reminder to property abutters on these streets, Per Chapter 12 of the Somersworth City Ordinance, there will be a three- or five-year moratorium on the cutting of the pavement road segments once they are paved. The moratorium precludes any pavement cutting projects, including new sewer, water, or natural gas tie-ins during the moratorium period.

If you are considering subdividing, expanding, rebuilding, or otherwise conducting property modifications such that a new sewer, water, or gas service is anticipated, we recommend making provisions now for tapping into the utilities that are under your street or road and bringing a future service stub out of the paved street and to your property line. This will be the time for you to inform us of your needs so that you can secure the necessary city permits and obtain the services of a contractor. It is important that you inform the Department of Public Works of any project you are considering as soon as possible at 603-692-4266.






Electronic/Metal Curbside Collection


The Glass Castle is truly astonishing-a memoir permeated by the intense love of a peculiar but loyal family.
