

TO AMEND CHAPTER 6 - CITY OFFICIALS, SECTION 6.6.2.4, PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

September 21, 2020

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the Ordinances of the City of Somersworth, as amended, be further amended as follows:

Remove Section 6.6.2.4 in entirely and replace with:

Section 6.6.2.4 Public Safety Committee

The purpose of the Committee is to consider matters relating to Police and Fire services and other emergency response needs of the City, as well as other matters referred to it. In order to be proactive and to continuously improve our quality of life, the Committee may also provide recommendations and guidance for Police, Fire, and other emergency operations in delivering services ethically and effectively to ensure the safety and security of the Public; and Public Trust is not compromised.

This Ordinance will take effect upon passage.

TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY TO USE FUNDING FROM THE FURBER MEMORIAL CHAPEL EXPENDABLE TRUST FUND AS A PORTION OF THE CITY'S MATCH TO A LAND AND COMMUNITY HERITAGE INVESTMENT PROGRAM GRANT FOR THE ROOF RESTORATION PROJECT ON THE FURBER MEMORIAL CHAPEL

#### October 19, 2020

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 25-20 to authorize the City Manager to enter into a grant agreement with the State of New Hampshire for a Land and Community Heritage Investment Program Grant to replace and restore the roof on the Furber Memorial Chapel, and

WHEREAS, city staff received bids for this project from qualified contractors and recommended awarding the project to Alden Bailey Restoration Corp. of Ridgefield, Connecticut, and

WHERAS, the Finance Committee reviewed this recommendation from staff and authorized awarding the contract for this project to Alden Bailey Restoration Corp. for an amount not to exceed \$55,000 (Fifty-Five Thousand dollars) including contingency, and

WHEREAS, to complete this project the City is required to provide a 50% match in the amount of \$27,500 (Twenty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred dollars), and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the City utilize the full balance available in the Furber Memorial Chapel Expendable Trust Fund to provide a portion of the City's match in the amount of approximately \$10,000 (Ten Thousand dollars) and close the fund,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the City may utilize the full balance available in the Furber Memorial Chapel Expendable Trust Fund to provide a portion of the City's match for the roof restoration project on the Furber Memorial Chapel.





### January 4, 2021

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 8-21 to establish a betterment assessment for the purpose of reconstructing Nadeau Street and accepting it as a City street, and

WHEREAS, the three (3) properties abutting Nadeau Street have executed an agreement with the City agreeing to the terms of the betterment assessment created by Resolution 8-21, and

WHEREAS, the recommended work and improvements necessary to bring Nadeau Street up to City standards are out to bid and work is anticipated to occur in the spring of 2021,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the City Council votes to conditionally lay out Nadeau Street as a Class V roadway subject to the condition that the vote is not final until the following conditions are met;

- The City Council receives from the City Engineer, certification that all recommended work and improvements on the road have been completed to City road standards, and
- All steps have been taken to secure the agreed upon repayment of costs of this work by the road abutters through Betterment Assessments.
