

TO AMEND CHAPTER 7, SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING, SECTION 7.4 - FEES

May 3, 2021

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the Ordinances of the City of Somersworth as amended, be further amended as follows:

Amend Chapter 7, Solid Waste and Recycling, Section 7.4 – Fees, by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

Section 7.4 – Fees: Effective July 1, 2021, the retail cost of the bags shall be \$2.15 for a 30-gallon bag and \$1.60 for a 15-gallon bag. Ten cents (.10) from the sale of each bag shall be utilized to subsidize the cost to the City for recycling or for any other cost related to solid waste and recycling collection and disposal. The cost to vendors shall be \$.02 cents less to provide financial incentive for selling the bags.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO AMEND THE CONTRACT WITH WRIGHT-PIERCE ENGINEERS OF PORTSMOUTH, NH FOR ENGINEERING AND DESIGN SERVICES FOR THE MAIN STREET AND CONSTITUTIONAL WAY COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT

May 3, 2021

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 18-18 authorizing the City Manager to contract with Wright-Pierce Engineers to provide engineering services for various complete streets projects including Main Street and Constitutional Way; and

WHEREAS, the City has been notified that these projects may be eligible for Federal funding; and

WHEREAS, the City has requested a proposal from Wright/Pierce for any additional funding required to get the engineering and design complete so the project is "shovel ready" this year in an effort to increase the opportunity to obtain Federal funding; and

WHEREAS, Wright-Pierce Engineers has provided the City a quote in the amount of \$197,000 (One Hundred Ninety-Seven Thousand dollars); and

WHEREAS, the Public Works and Environment Committee reviewed this quote with City staff and recommends amending the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Committee reviewed this quote with City staff and recommends amending the contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSWORTH THAT the City Manager is authorized to amend the contract for engineering and design service for the Main Street and Constitutional Way Complete Streets projects with Wright-Pierce Engineers by \$197,000 (One Hundred Ninety-Seven Thousand dollars) and take any and all other such actions relative to this project determined to be in the best interest of the City.
