How to play:

Blindfold the guesser. Choose items to put inside the box or boxes depending on how many you have (see suggestions above). Have them stick their hand inside the box and feel the contents while trying to guess what's inside. See how many you can identify! Materials needed:

- **Tissue Boxes**
- White spray paint or white paper
- White felt
- Scissors
- Glue gun or glue sticks

Black felt (for ghost)

 $(\ 0\)$

- Wiggly eyes (1" wide for mummy)
- Gauze (for mummy)
- Black and red paint (for skeleton)

Spray boxes white or cover with white cardstock or construction paper. Make hole on top of tissue box a little bigger if you need to so that a hand can fit inside. Cut white felt to fit top of tissue box. Fold felt in half and cut a V shape. Open the fold up and cut another couple of slits. Glue felt to the top of your box.

Ghost—Use black felt to cut 2 ovals for eyes and a bigger oval for mouth. Optional: add eyebrows. Glue on front of box.

Mummy—Wrap box with gauze going diagonal, straight across, diagonal again. Add glue as you go to hold together. Glue on wiggly eyes . Optional: add scar with paint.

Skeleton—Draw face on with black and red paint or markers.
