Ingredients:

- 4 Tablespoons butter (1/2 stick)
- 10 Ounces mini marshmallows
- 6 Cups crispy rice cereal
- 2 Ounces white chocolate (baking chocolate or melts)
- 16 candy eyes
- 16 chocolate covered pretzels
- M&Ms (7 brown, 1 red)
- Christmas sprinkles
- In a large pot melt butter over medium heat. Add marshmallows, stir to coat with butter and allow to melt completely, stirring frequently. Remove pot from heat and gently mix in cereal until fully combined.
- Transfer mixture into a greased 8-inch cake pan and press evenly in pan. Allow to cool completely. Run a knife or spatula around the edge of the pan, lay a plate or cutting board on top and flip over. Carefully lift off pan and cut into 8 triangle pieces.
- Melt half of white chocolate. Spread a small amount on the back of candy eyes and press 2 on each triangle. Do the same with M&M nose and pretzel antlers on each triangle. Melt remaining white chocolate, spread between antlers, cover with sprinkles and gently press down on sprinkles. Allow to harden before serving.

Materials:

- Straight sticks or cinnamon sticks (6 inch)
- Hot glue gun

Ribbons

Scissors



- Twine
- 1. Tie scraps of ribbon down the twig or cinnamon stick. Bunch them close together. Gently tug them into place.
- 2. Trim ribbons into a Christmas tree shape (wider on the bottom and narrower on the top).
- 3. Hot glue or tie a loop of twine to the top of the tree.
- 4. Optional: Top the tree with a wooden star, yellow button, or primitive metal star.
- 5. Hang the ornament on your Christmas tree or you can give it as a gift!
