Spring is Here

Spring is the time to cleanup garages, basements and yards. Lubricants and hazardous

materials can be disposed of during advertised collection days dedicated solely to the pick-up of these items. Otherwise metal and electronic items can be dropped off at the DPW yard once stickers for disposal have been purchased at City Hall for \$4 per item.

Spring also means that citizens will be burning their downed tree limbs and garden preparation materials. A Permit is required by the State of New Hampshire for such activities and that Permit can be obtained at the Fire Department.

Bagged Leaves and Brush Pickup

Brush will be picked up the third week in April and May. You must call 692-4266 by Friday, April 14th and/or Friday, May 12th to be added to the pickup list. Please have your brush curbside no later than 7:00am on Monday, April 20th and/or Monday, May 18th for pickup. Brush can be up to five (5) inches in diameter and ten (10) feet long. PLEASE NOTE: Brush pickup is limited to 20 minutes per stop. Any remaining brush and cleanup of debris is the responsibility of the property owner.

Bagged Leaves will be picked up the fourth week in April and May. You do not have to call ahead for bagged leaves pickup. Please have leaves curbside no later than 7:00am on your trash pickup day the week of April 24th and/or May 22nd. Leaves and grass clippings must be in brown paper leaf bags, sold at many local stores.

What are Household Hazardous Waste Products?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW), also called retail hazardous waste or home generated special materials is a product that when it's used or disposed of poses a threat to your health or the environment. To help you identify these hazardous products, federal law requires them to be labeled with warnings about their use, storage, and disposal. The words "Danger" (most toxic), "Warning", Poison" and "Caution" (least toxic) are used to help identify the various degrees of toxicity. These words and the properties that make the product hazardous are listed to help you use these products safely.

What To Do With a Potential Hazardous Product

- * Identify which items are hazardous household wastes
- * Set aside those products that you will use up before you move
- * Ask someone if they want any of the remaining products.
- * Check with your city or town to see when the next household hazardous waste collection day will be held
- * DO NOT dispose of any chemicals, petroleum products, or other hazardous wastes down the drain or on the ground. IT IS AGAINST THE LAW.



"In the Gardens of Beasts" by Erik Larson

The time is 1933, the place, Berlin, when William E. Dodd becomes America's first ambassador to Hitler's Nazi Germany in a year that proved to be a turning point in history. As evidence of Jewish persecution mounts, confirmed by chilling first-person testimony, Dodd telegraphs his concerns to an indifferent State Department. They all watch with alarm as Jews are attacked, the press is censored, and drafts of

Emptying the Medicine Cabinet Disposal Guidelines for Pharmaceuticals in the Home

Unused or expired medications are a public safety issue and can lead to poisoning, abuse and overdose. They can also leach into the water supply and surface water.

- 1) Pour medicine into a sealable plastic bag.
- 2) If the medicine is a solid, add a small amount of water to dissolve it.
- 3) Add coffee grounds, kitty litter or something similar to the liquid medicine in the plastic bag.
 - 4) Seal the bag and immediately dispose of it in the trash.
- 5) Use a marker to black out any personal contact information on the empty medicine container prior to disposing of it in the trash.

Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs and Mercury: What Consumers Should Know

Compact fluorescent lightbulbs (CFLs) are more energy efficient than incandescent bulbs, and overall CFLs have a lower impact on the environment, including a reduction of mercury emissions from coal plants. However, one of the components of CFLs is a small amount of mercury. When released, mercury can pose a serious hazard to human health and harm the environment.

It is against the law in New Hampshire to dispose of any mercury-containing products in landfills, incinerators, or transfer stations. Instead, return burned-out bulbs to the retailer, who will recycle them (call ahead).

If a bulb breaks, you should protect yourself from inhalation or absorption into your skin.
