# General Election November 3, 2020 Polls are Open from 7:00 am - 8:00 pm

For the 2020 General Elections, voters are allowed to appear at their Ward's polling place and deliver their own completed absentee ballots in the same manner they would deliver an absentee ballot to the City Clerk prior to Election day.

PLEASE NOTE: Absentee Ballots must be received no later than 5:00 PM on Election Day. After 5:00 PM on Election Day, absentee ballots cannot be accepted but the voter can still vote in person at their Ward polling place.

Solid Waste and Recycling News Updates

Thanksgiving Holiday: There will be No Change to the regular schedule residential

trash and recycling collection.

Reminder the next Metal/Electronics curbside collection by Public Works crews will occur on November 10. Residents should call by Friday,November 6 to be placed on the pick-up list. Use of bulky waste/metal waste stickers is required and can be purchased at City Hall, City Clerk office. Bulky waste/metal stickers can also be purchased at the DPW building at 18 Lilac Lane by check only. The number to call at Public Works is 692-4266.

### **Fall Clean up Services**

**Brush pick up**: Public Works Highway crews will start collecting **residential brush** during the week of November 16 through November 20. Residents need to call Public Works at 692-4266 by Friday, November 13 to be placed on the pick-up list.

Department Highway crews will also be collecting **bagged leaves** the week of November 23 through November 27. Residents should place their bagged leaves curbside on their regular trash pick-up day. The paper leaf bags can be purchased at grocery store chains, hardware stores, and Home Depot.

### **Malley Farm**

Reminder that the Malley Farm brush and leaf pile will remain open through the Fall and early Winter as long as the weather conditions permit. Typically Malley Farm will close after the first major snow event in the City.

## Somersworth Fire Department & Emergency Management

### Pandemic, Complacency, and the Heating Season A safety message from the Fire Chief's Office

**COVID-19 Reminders:** Unless you have been fortunate enough to take a page out of Rip Van Winkle's play book, you know that there may be a resurgence in the number of Corona Virus cases in the near future. In order to avoid complacency, reduce risk, and protect yourself with the best information we have – remember to:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid close contact with others. When outside your home, keep a distance of at least 6 feet between yourself and others. This is known as social distancing.
- Wear a cloth face covering that covers your mouth and nose to protect others when in

public areas.

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands.
- Do not touch your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Stay home if you have a fever or are not feeling well.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

**Fire Prevention** – **Smoke Detectors & other Home Safety Tips:** So far in 2020, New Hampshire has experienced one of the deadliest stretches of fire deaths in the State's recent history with the common factor being a lack of working smoke detectors. The state fire marshal's office said 8 people died in 7 home fires this year and there were no confirmed, working smoke alarms. Across the country, an average of over 3,000 people a year lose their lives in house fires. If you do not have a 10-year battery in your smoke alarm, please change the batteries when you change your clocks and test the smoke alarms once per month. Most house fires occur between 6 PM and 6 AM. Consequently, we ask everyone to sleep with their doors close to block the smoke. Continuing with our Fire Prevention theme, we ask that if you are cooking, do not leave your stove unattended.

Cold weather is starting to set in: "Give space heaters plenty of space" - place a pace heater at least three feet from anything that can burn and don't use them as the main source of warmth. Don't leave a space heater unattended. If you leave the room or go to sleep, turn off and unplug the space heater. Don't use space heaters near water (in the bathroom) and ensure you use the type of space heater that automatically shuts off when it tips over.

Active Fire Scene Safety: A key aspect of fire rescue and suppression is to establish a water supply from a fire hydrant to the pumper truck. We make this connection using a very large yellow hose. Occasionally, the public may try to drive over a fire hose. Unfortunately, if a fire hose is driven over with a motor vehicle, the added pressure can cause the hose to burst or damage to the pump thus endangering firefighters and trapped civilians. If your vehicle is blocked in by a fire hose, please do not drive over the hose and if experiencing an emergency, please see a uniformed fire official.

**Some History – Burn Permits & Dry Season Safety Tips:** Last month we provided a short discussion on how Fire Prevention Month is tied to the famous Great Chicago Fire. However, a lesser known but more deadly fire occurred on the same day in the vicinity of Peshtigo Wisconsin. The summer of 1871 had been extremely hot and dry in northeastern Wisconsin and Upper Michigan. Farming, logging, and the wood products industry had created many brush and branch piles. Low humidity, dry conditions, strong winds and a spark resulted in the death of over 1500 people.

In present day Somersworth, we had a very busy August due to dry conditions, high wind, and many brush fires. As I write this column, snow is forecast for tomorrow. However, before we know it, Red Sox pitchers and catchers will report to Ft Myers, Florida and the branches, leaves, and other natural vegetation left over from our recent drought may become fuel for the next round of drought and brush fires. Consequently, we ask everyone to clean up the immediate vicinity around homes and buildings to ensure dry vegetation that may catch fire does not lead to a structure fire. Although bark mulch requires little maintenance, holds moisture in the soil, and can reduce erosion, the material can become combustible tinder in dry weather. We also ask the public to be very careful with opening burning and comply with all restrictions and warnings.

Feel free to call the Fire Station if you have questions about any emergency management, fire prevention, or life safety topics.

# **SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING**

Permits for Noble Street and River Street parking during snow emergency parking bans will become available beginning October 1, 2020.

Permit parking during snow emergency parking bans is allowed on Noble Street adjacent to the Noble Pines Park, and on River Street adjacent to Jules Bisson Park.

There are 17 spaces available on Noble Street and 5 spaces available on River Street. Permits will be issued on a first come, first served basis. The permits are only valid during the dates listed when there is a snow emergency parking ban in effect. Vehicles parked in this area with a valid permit must be moved by 8 am on the day following the completion of the parking ban to allow for snow removal from the designated area. Vehicles not moved per the Ordinance will be subject to being towed at the owners expense.

Permits to park during parking bans resulting from a snow emergency are available from November 1st thru March 31st at a rate of \$20.00 per month, and are available at the Police Department. Please call 692-3131 for more information.
